### Principal <u>ABOUT THE TOPIC</u> FUNDAMENTALS OF BIOSTATISTICS AND HYPOTHESIS TESTING

Hypothesis testing (or statistical inference) is one of the major applications of biostatistics. Much of medical research begins with a research question that can be framed as a hypothesis. Inferential statistics begins with a null hypothesis that reflects the conservative position of no change or no difference in comparison to baseline or between groups. Usually, the researcher has reason to believe that there is some effect or some difference which is the alternative hypothesis. The researcher therefore proceeds to study samples and measure outcomes in the hope of generating evidence strong enough for the statistician to be able to reject the null hypothesis. The concept of the *P* value is almost universally used in hypothesis testing.

Much of statistics involves collecting, describing, and analyzing data that are subject to random variation. Descriptive statistics presents and summarizes collected data to characterize features of their distribution. Inferential statistics analyzes sample data in order to estimate or predict characteristics of the larger population from which the sample is drawn.

Biological phenomena are inherently variable and in this age of "evidence-based medicine" an understanding of such variation through statistical approaches is essential not only for the medical researcher who intends to draw inferences from his sample, but also for the practicing clinician, and the medical teacher whose responsibility is to critically appraise the presented inferences before accepting them into practice or the curriculum. Development of new drugs, devices, and techniques is heavily dependent, nowadays, upon statistical analyses to prove their effectiveness. It is also frequently alleged that statistical analyses can be misused and misrepresented. This should be a further impetus for understanding inferential statistics.

#### Steps in hypothesis testing

Hypothesis testing, as it stands now, should proceed through the following five steps:

- Select a study design and sample size appropriate to the research question or hypothesis to be tested
- Decide upon the hypothesis test (i.e., test of statistical significance) that is to be applied for each outcome variable of interest
- Once the data have been collected, apply the test and determine the P value from the results observed
- Compare it with the critical value of P, say 0.05 or 0.01
- If the P value is less than the critical value, reject the null hypothesis (and rejoice) or otherwise
  accept the null hypothesis (and reflect on the reasons why no difference was detected).

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



### ABOUT THE SEMINAR

The skin offers an accessible and convenient site for the administration of medications. To this end, the field of transdermal drug delivery, aimed at developing safe and efficacious means of delivering medications across the skin, has in the past and continues to garner much time and investment with the continuous advancement of new and innovative approaches. This review details the progress and current status of the transdermal drug delivery field and describes numerous pharmaceutical developments which have been employed to overcome limitations associated with skin delivery systems. Advantages and disadvantages of the various approaches are detailed, commercially marketed products are highlighted and particular attention is paid to the emerging field of microneedle technologies.

Technologies used to modify the barrier properties of the stratum corneum can be divided into passive/chemical or active/physical methodologies . Passive methods include the influencing of drug and vehicle interactions and optimization of formulation, in order to modify the stratum corneum structure Passive methods are relatively easy to incorporate into transdermal patches such as chemical enhancers and emulsions However, the main drawback of passive methods may be a lag time in drug release incurred with obvious negative influence on rapid onset drugs, such as insulin.

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### ABOUT THE TOPIC SPSS CORRELATION AND LINEAR REGRESSION

#### Introduction

Linear regression is the next step up after correlation. It is used when we want to predict the value of a variable based on the value of another variable. The variable we want to predict is called the dependent variable (or sometimes, the outcome variable). The variable we are using to predict the other variable's value is called the independent variable (or sometimes, the predictor variable). For example, you could use linear regression to understand whether exam performance can be predicted based on revision time; whether cigarette consumption can be predicted based on smoking duration; and so forth. If you have two or more independent variables, rather than just one, you need to use multiple regression.

This "quick start" guide shows you how to carry out linear regression using SPSS Statistics, as well as interpret and report the results from this test. However, before we introduce you to this procedure, you need to understand the different assumptions that your data must meet in order for linear regression to give you a valid result. We discuss these assumptions next.

SPSS Statistics

Assumptions

When you choose to analyse your data using linear regression, part of the process involves checking to make sure that the data you want to analyse can actually be analysed using linear regression. You need to do this because it is only appropriate to use linear regression if your data "passes" seven assumptions that are required for linear regression to give you a valid result. In practice, checking for these seven assumptions just adds a little bit more time to your analysis, requiring you to click a few more buttons in SPSS Statistics when performing your analysis, as well as think a little bit more about your data, but it is not a difficult task.

Output of Linear Regression Analysis

SPSS Statistics will generate quite a few tables of output for a linear regression. In this section, we show you only the three main tables required to understand your results from the linear regression procedure, assuming that no assumptions have been violated. A complete explanation of the output you have to interpret when checking your data for the six assumptions required to carry out linear regression is provided in our enhanced guide. This includes relevant scatterplots, histogram (with superimposed normal curve), Normal P-P Plot, casewise diagnostics and the Durbin-Watson statistic. Below, we focus on the results for the linear regression analysis only.

### ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF PHARMACIST IN MEDICATION RECONCILIATION

#### MEDICATION RECONCILIATION

The process of identifying the most accurate list of all medications that the patient is taking, including name, dosage, frequency, and route, by comparing the medical record to an external list of medications obtained from a patient, hospital, or other provider.

#### REASON FOR IMPLEMENTATION

Transitions from one healthcare setting to another – whether from an intensive care unit to a general ward or from a rehabilitation facility to the patient's home – increase the risks of adverse drug events and can contribute to avoidable hospital visits. For instance, incomplete or inaccurate medication information can introduce changes to patients' outpatient medication regimens that were not intended by hospital-based physicians. Two common unintended medication changes are omissions – pre-admission medications are omitted from hospital orders and therefore not continued after discharge – and commissions – previous medications that patients discontinued prior to admission are inadvertently re-initiated in the hospital and therefore continued upon dischargeo cause moderate to severe discomfort or clinical deterioration.


#### ROLES AND RESPONSBILITIES

The pharmacist, wherever possible, should take primary responsibility for ensuring proper communication of medication information to patients/clients, families and other healthcare providers on admission, transfer, and discharge.

### ANTIBIOTIC PROPHYLAXIS

Antibiotic prophylaxis is defined as the administration of antibiotics before contamination by surgical incision has occurred and is given with the intention of preventing infection. Antibiotics are medicines used to prevent and treat bacterial infections. Antibiotic usage is increasing rapidly day by day with or without prescription. Irrational prescription usage, negligence of standard guidelines and antimicrobial resistance are increasing complexity in the therapy and the desired outcome. The aim of antibiotic prophylaxis in surgery is to prevent SSI whilst minimizing the collateral damage that occurs with all antibiotic use.

## Goals Of Antibiotic Prophylaxis

- Reduce The Incidence of surgical site Infection (SSI)
- > Minimize the effect on the patients normal bacterial flora
- Minimize the adverse effects of antibiotics
- Minimize the emergence of antibiotics resistant strains of bacteria
- Cost effectiveness

## Roles and Responsibilities Of Pharmacist In Antibiotic Prophylaxis

- According to an ASHP statement, a pharmacist involved in the ASP has responsibilities to promote optimal antimicrobial use, to reduce the transmission of infections and to educated other healthcare professionals, patients, and the public.
- Educating the pharmacy staff on the risks of antibiotic resistant and emphasis on their role in helping to reduce the prevalence of resistance is an essential issue. Pharmacists have to accept these challenges to ensure that antibiotics are used appropriately even during the self-medication.
- The addition of a dedicated antibiotic pharmacist to an active team has been shown to benefit patients by reducing medication errors and length of hospital stay ,encouraging oral medication, and ensuring appropriate drug choice.

### ABOUT THE COURSE

Growing awareness of Ayurvedic medicines and formulations has led to several conflicts with western pharmaceutical companies who are taking the lead from Ayurvedic medicines and patenting them in their own name. But as we are all aware that the intellects involved behind constructing this unique science is very much grass rooted in India and the country is responsible for producing the majority of Ayurvedic leads right from the traditional times. An overview of understanding the concept, rules, laws, regulations, present status, controlling authorities with emphasis on its statistical inference to understand the future challenges of Intellectual Property Rights and how to restore our scientific knowledge to promote ideas and make them acceptable without financial constraints. Evaluating and reviewing the terms, criteria's included in IPR. The outcome is pretty much predictable that we need rules, proper structured laws to protect our patents, our natural resources and for proper understanding of IPR courses conducted on it should be increased. Considering the statistical aspects the execution of IPR has decreased over the years due to lack of systematic indulgence in traditional system of medicine. The number of governing bodies included has expensive and strict vigilances that decrease the promotion of ideas from the mass people as they are very few governing bodies. A proper council easily understandable and approachable is of utmost importance.

World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) has been sensitive to these concerns. At a conference held in October 1998, under the aegis of the WIPO an agenda for the future of IPR in the field of traditional medicines was prepared, which prioritized activities in this area, namely, development of standards for the availability, scope and use of IPRs on traditional medicine in Asian countries, systematic documentation of traditional medicine for protection purposes, regional and inter-regional information exchange and compilation of the requisite databases, etc. This agenda needs to be moved forward

Ayurveda is the pioneer of medical science. Over the years the knowledge is being subsided due to lack of literature thus leading to improper understanding of the science. In recent years Ayurveda has provided miraculous lead compounds that has shown tremendous therapeutic efficacy with minimum side effects as possible. Thus to preserve, conserve and deliver this science to the world Intellectual Property Right must be maintained until the compounds are validated by experts dealing with it

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



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

#### Patent Rules for Intellectual Property Rights (IPRs) Cell

Centre for Industry Institution Partnership Programme (CIIPP) has been striving to act as a podium for development and transfer of Technical and Managerial competence in the area of research and academics to meet the changing needs of the corporate sector and society at large, initiative in this direction has created Intellectual Property Rights Cell (IPR Cell) in collaboration with National and State patent agencies. IPR Cell will provide information, orientation and facilities to faculties, scientists and research students and of BBAU for protecting the products of their intellectual capabilities. The Cell would also be able to guide and advise researchers on how to obtain and sustain patents, facilitate routing of patent searches to National and State patent agencies and university and getting the necessary clearances from the competent authorities in the university while filing provisional/complete patent specifications. This Cell would also workout various modalities on behalf of the University for Technology transfer/ commercialization of patented technologies.

#### Objective and Activities of the Patent Cell

- 1. To provide IPRs protection information, orientation and facilities to university researchers & scientists.
- To guide and advise researchers on how to obtain and sustain patents and help them to approach National and State patent agencies.
- 3. To work as a link between National and State patent agencies and university.
- 4. To facilitate routing of patent searchers to National and State patent agencies.
- To get necessary clearances from competent authorities while filing patents and other IPRs like copyright registration and design registration, etc. through National and State patent agencies.
- 6. To workout modalities on behalf of the universities for commercialization of patented technologies.
- To organize various IPR awareness programmes in collaboration with National and State patent agencies, in its campus.
- CIIPP/University will provide the financial support, if needed by the faculty, for preparation and submission of the patent application after a preliminary scrutiny.

#### Patent Registration

Patent registration in India can be obtained for any invention relating to a product or process that is new, involving inventive step and capable of industrial application. The following items cannot be patented, as they are not considered as inventions under the <u>Patent Act</u>, 1970:

Application for patent registration must be made to the Indian Patent Office in the prescribed format. A patent application can be filed either by true and first inventor or his assignee, either alone or jointly with any other person. It is important to remember that the application for patent should be filed before the publication of the invention and till then it should not be disclosed or published.

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

#### ABOUT THE TOPIC

#### EXCEPTIONS AND LIMITATIONS OF PATENT RIGHTS

Patent rights is considered as an incentive for investment in innovative activities and the production of knowledge, allowing the enforcement of the full scope of the exclusive rights in all circumstances may not always meet the ultimate goal of the patent system to enhance the public welfare. Therefore, in order to strike the right balance between the interests of the right holders, third parties and the public, the scope of the enforceable exclusive rights may be set under national patent laws according to certain exceptions and limitations to patent rights that have been reserved for decision by individual countries.

#### Private and Non-commercial Use Exception

The exclusive rights conferred by a patent do not allow private use or monopoly over commercial activity. If a patentee is neither using nor vending the invention for profit, the Government has the power to grant a license, known as Compulsory License (CL), to a third party to use the patented invention so as to restrict the rights of the patentee for the purpose of preventing the abuse/ misuse of the rights by the property holder and to prevent the negative effect of such action on the public.

#### Experimental / Scientific Use Exception

The experimental use exemption is incorporated under Section 47 of the Act. Under sub section 3 of the said section, the grant of a patent is subject to the condition that any product or process, in respect of which the patent is granted, may be made or used by any person for the purpose merely of experiment or research including the imparting of instructions to pupils.

#### Regulatory-use/Prior-use Exemption

This exemption is also referred as Bolar Provision and is a statutorily created exemption to patent rights that allows the manufacturers of generic drugs to undertake steps reasonably related to the development and submission of information required for obtaining marketing approval anywhere in the world in respect of a patented product without the consent of the patentee. Some countries permit the generic drug manufacturers to use the technology of a patented drug to generate data and to demonstrate bioequivalence that would assist in the regulatory or marketing approval of the generic product, while the patent is still in force.

#### **Exhaustion of Patent Rights**

The Doctrine of Exhaustion or First Sale Doctrine refers to the exhaustion of the exclusive rights of the patent holder once the patented invention is sold without any restriction. As per this Doctrine, the first unrestricted sale of a patented item exhausts the patentee's further control over that particular





### ABOUT THE COURSE

Intellectual property rights (IPR) have been defined as ideas, inventions, and creative expressions based on which there is a public willingness to bestow the status of property. IPR provide certain exclusive rights to the inventors or creators of that property, in order to enable them to reap commercial benefits from their creative efforts or reputation. There are several types of intellectual property protection like patent, copyright, trademark, etc. Patent is a recognition for an invention, which satisfies the criteria of global novelty, non-obviousness, and industrial application. IPR is prerequisite for better identification, planning, commercialization, rendering, and thereby protection of invention or creativity. Each industry should evolve its own IPR policies, management style, strategies, and so on depending on its area of specialty. Pharmaceutical industry currently has an evolving IPR strategy requiring a better focus and approach in the coming era.

Competition in the global pharmaceutical industry is driven by scientific knowledge rather than manufacturing know-how and a company's success will be largely dependent on its R&D efforts. Therefore, investments in R&D in the drug industry are very high as a percentage of total sales; reports suggest that it could be as much as 15% of the sale. One of the key issues in this industry is the management of innovative risks while one strives to gain a competitive advantage over rival organizations. There is high cost attached to the risk of failure in pharmaceutical R&D with the development of potential medicines that are unable to meet the stringent safety standards, being terminated, sometimes after many years of investment. For those medicines that do clear development hurdles, it takes about 8-10 years from the date when the compound was first synthesized.

Different forms of IPR demand different treatment, handling, planning, and strategies and engagement of persons with different domain knowledge such as science, engineering, medicines, law, finance, marketing, and economics. Each industry should evolve its own IP policies, management style, strategies, etc. depending on its area of specialty. Pharmaceutical industry currently has an evolving IP strategy. Since there exists the increased possibility that some IPR are invalid, antitrust law, therefore, needs to step in to ensure that invalid rights are not being unlawfully asserted to establish and maintain illegitimate, albeit limited, monopolies within the pharmaceutical industry. Still many things remain to be resolved in this context.

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

### ABOUT THE COURSE

Intellectual property rights (IPR) have been defined as ideas, inventions, and creative expressions based on which there is a public willingness to bestow the status of property. IPR provide certain exclusive rights to the inventors or creators of that property, in order to enable them to reap commercial benefits from their creative efforts or reputation. There are several types of intellectual property protection like patent, copyright, trademark, etc. Patent is a recognition for an invention, which satisfies the criteria of global novelty, non-obviousness, and industrial application. IPR is prerequisite for better identification, planning, commercialization, rendering, and thereby protection of invention or creativity. Each industry should evolve its own IPR policies, management style, strategies, and so on depending on its area of specialty. Pharmaceutical industry currently has an evolving IPR strategy requiring a better focus and approach in the coming era.

Competition in the global pharmaceutical industry is driven by scientific knowledge rather than manufacturing know-how and a company's success will be largely dependent on its R&D efforts. There is high cost attached to the risk of failure in pharmaceutical R&D with the development of potential medicines that are unable to meet the stringent safety standards, being terminated, sometimes after many years of investment. For those medicines that do clear development hurdles, it takes about 8-10 years from the date when the compound was first synthesized.

Different forms of IPR demand different treatment, handling, planning, and strategies and engagement of persons with different domain knowledge such as science, engineering, medicines, law, finance, marketing, and economics. Each industry should evolve its own IP policies, management style, strategies, etc. depending on its area of specialty. Pharmaceutical industry currently has an evolving IP strategy. Since there exists the increased possibility that some IPR are invalid, antitrust law, therefore, needs to step in to ensure that invalid rights are not being unlawfully asserted to establish and maintain illegitimate, albeit limited, monopolies within the pharmaceutical industry. Still many things remain to be resolved in this context.



### Objectives:

### ABOUT THE TOPIC

### PATENTING OF BIO-INVENTIONS

### INTRODUCTION

A patent is an exclusive right granted by a government for an invention, which is a product or a process that provides, in general, a new way of doing something, or offers a new technical solution to a problem. The details on the way of acquiring patents will be provided for protecting precious intellectual properties.

### CRITERIA FOR GRANTING A PATENT

In order to be patentable, an invention must meet the following three criteria:

- a. It must be new:
- b. It must involve an inventive step(that is, non-obvious to a person skilled in the relevant field of technology); and
- c. It must be capable of industrial application.

### USE OF PATENT

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

#### ABOUT THE SEMINAR

Biopharmaceutics examines the interrelationship of the physical/chemical properties of the drug, the dosage form (drug product) in which the drug is given, and the route of administration on the rate and extent of systemic drug absorption. The importance of the drug substance and the drug formulation on absorption, and in vivo distribution of the drug to the site of action, is described as a sequence of events that precede elicitation of a drug's therapeutic effect. A general scheme describing this dynamic relationship is illustrated

Biopharmaceutics provides the scientific basis for drug product design and drug product development. Each step in the manufacturing process of a finished dosage form may potentially affect the release of the drug from the drug product and the availability of the drug at the site of action. The most important steps in the manufacturing process are termed *critical manufacturing variables*. Examples of biopharmaceutic considerations in drug product design are listed in A detailed discussion of drug product design is found in Knowledge of physiologic factors necessary for designing oral products are discussed in. Finally, drug product quality and drug product testing are discussed in later chapters.

After a drug is released from its dosage form, the drug is absorbed into the surrounding tissue, the body, or both. The distribution through and elimination of the drug in the body varies for each patient but can be characterized using mathematical models and statistics. Pharmacokinetics is the science of the kinetics of drug absorption, distribution, and elimination (ie, metabolism and excretion). The description of drug distribution and elimination is often termed drug disposition. Characterization of drug disposition is an important prerequisite for determination or modification of dosing regimens for individuals and groups of patients. The study of pharmacokinetics involves both experimental and theoretical approaches. The experimental aspect of pharmacokinetics involves the development of biological sampling techniques, analytical methods for the measurement of drugs and metabolites, and procedures that facilitate data collection and manipulation. The theoretical aspect of pharmacokinetics involves the development of pharmacokinetic models that predict drug disposition after drug administration. The application of statistics is an integral part of pharmacokinetic studies. Statistical methods are used for pharmacokinetic parameter estimation and data interpretation ultimately for the purpose of designing and predicting optimal dosing regimens for individuals or groups of patients. Statistical methods are applied to pharmacokinetic models to determine data error and structural model deviations. Mathematics and computer techniques form the theoretical basis of many pharmacokinetic methods. Classical pharmacokinetics is a study of theoretical models focusing mostly on model development and parameterization



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

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
