Introduction:

The workshop on Roles and Responsibilities of Pharmacist in Medication Reconciliation was held on October 14th ,2022 at JKKMMRF's AnnaiSampoooraniAmmal College of Pharmacy. The purpose of the workshop was to provide attendees with basic ideas of medication reconciliation and its roles and responsibilies of a pharmacist who attend ward rounds in a hospital. At the end of the workshop, all attendees received a certificate of completion.

Objectives:

The main objectives of the workshop were to:

- Introduce attendees the term Medication Reconciliation and its importance.
- -Areas where the medication reconciliation can be applied in a hospital.
- Roles and responsibility of pharmacists in the medication reconciliation process.

Advantages and disadvantages of medication reconciliation

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Participants:

The workshop was open to all students at JKKMMRF's AnnaiSampoooraniAmmal College of Pharmacy, and a total of 345 students participated. The attendees represented a range of academic disciplines within the field of pharmacy, including pharmacology, pharmaceutical chemistry, and pharmacy practice. Most of the attendees had some prior experience with medication reconciliation process during their internship period.

Format:

The workshop was structured as a combination of lectures, group discussions, along with quiz programme. The lectures were led by an experienced senior clinical pharmacists, and the quiz session was conducted by the pharmacy practice faculties. The winners of the quiz competition were given with awards. The workshop was held over one full day, with breaks in between to allow attendees to rest and ask questions.

Content:

The workshop covered a range of topics related toimportance, roles and responsibilities of pharmacist in medication reconciliation. The one dayprogramme focused on, attendees learned about the areas where the pharmacist have to be focused during medication reconciliation. The apt application of reconciliation process for a patient during reconciliation process. The advantages and disadvanges of this reportin process were clearly explained to the attendees.

Evaluation:

At the end of the workshop, attendees were asked to complete a short evaluation form to provide feedback on the workshop. Overall, the evaluations were very positive, with most attendees rating the workshop as "excellent" or "good." Attendees commented that the lectures were clear and well-organized, and that the quiz programme contributes enjoyment for the attendees at the end.

Conclusion:

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ABOUT THE TOPIC

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF PHARMACIST IN MEDICATION RECONCILIATION

MEDICATION RECONCILIATION

The process of identifying the most accurate list of all medications that the patient is taking, including name, dosage, frequency, and route, by comparing the medical record to an external list of medications obtained from a patient, hospital, or other provider.

REASON FOR IMPLEMENTATION

Transitions from one healthcare setting to another – whether from an intensive care unit to a general ward or from a rehabilitation facility to the patient's home – increase the risks of adverse drug events and can contribute to avoidable hospital visits. For instance, incomplete or inaccurate medication information can introduce changes to patients' outpatient medication regimens that were not intended by hospital-based physicians. Two common unintended medication changes are omissions – pre-admission medications are omitted from hospital orders and therefore not continued after discharge – and commissions – previous medications that patients discontinued prior to admission are inadvertently re-initiated in the hospital and therefore continued upon dischargeo cause moderate to severe discomfort or clinical deterioration.


ROLES AND RESPONSBILITIES

The pharmacist's role is to coordinate the medication reconciliation process. The pharmacist, wherever possible, should take primary responsibility for ensuring proper communication of medication information to patients/clients, families and other healthcare providers on admission, transfer, and discharge.
